# **Puget Sound Conservation District Caucus Priorities and Next Steps**

Originally Adopted October 27, 2014; Updated Edition Adopted August 27, 2018

This document presents the Puget Sound Conservation District Caucus' priorities for the period 2015-2018, and action steps for each priority.

### **Programs and Services**

The Puget Sound Conservation District Caucus works together to develop, fund, and implement programs and services that engage land managers in solutions that build community, foster stewardship, and restore and maintain Puget Sound and the Salish Sea.

### **2015-2018 Priorities:**

- 1. Small acreage and livestock programs and services (Status Completed)
- 2. Forest health management programs and services (rural and urban) (Status Completed)
- 3. Aquatic area protection and enhancement programs and services (marine and freshwater) (Status Completed)
- 4. LID and other green stormwater infrastructure programs and services (Status Completed)
- 5. Sustainable, equitable, and resilient regional food system (Status Completed)
- 6. Fix failing septic systems to protect and restore shellfish (Status In-progress)
- 7. Incorporate an engaging outreach and communication strategy into each program and service (Status In-progress)
- 8. Connect Caucus priorities to regional priorities such as the Puget Sound Partnership's (PSP)
  Action Agenda. Develop common language for local Near-Term Actions (NTA). (Status In-progress)

### **Next Steps:**

- 1. Finish developing Portfolio of Regional Program and Services descriptions (Status Completed)
  - a. Establish and staff work groups
  - b. Bring draft materials to full Caucus for review
  - c. Connect programs to existing PSP NTA and regional strategic initiatives
  - d. Identify District programs that can support new NTA and regional strategic initiatives
- 2. Identify short and long term actions for each program (Status Pending)
  - a. Develop these in work groups
  - b. Bring draft materials to full Caucus for review
- 3. Create PSCDC annual work plan and five-year strategic plan (Status Pending)
  - a. Develop these in work groups
  - b. Bring draft materials to full Caucus for review
  - c. Have work plans inform both WSCC and WACD work planning
- 4. Create a procedure and timeline for incorporating these programs/services into member Districts' annual work plans and five-year strategic plans (Status Pending)
  - a. With Caucus input and direction, Shana to develop draft for review
  - b. Edit and adopt
  - c. Each Caucus member is responsible for following the procedure and timeline
- 5. Identify and pursue funding opportunities (Status Ongoing)

- a. Establish work group to identify funding opportunities and opportunities for proactive engagement with funders
- b. Bring draft materials to full Caucus for review
- c. Create templates for grant applications
- d. Submit funding applications and proposals

## **Regional and Statewide Engagement**

The Puget Sound Conservation District Caucus works together to achieve conservation objectives at the regional and statewide levels.

#### **2015-2018 Priorities:**

- 1. Create a common language to describe conservation district priorities (Status Ongoing)
- 2. Develop a business plan, and a business case for investing in Caucus activities (Status Drafted)
- 3. Create a bold communications strategy and engagement platform to raise literacy around what Conservation Districts stand for (Status In-progress)
- 4. Develop and communicate Caucus perspectives on policy proposals
- 5. Strengthen partnership with WSCC and WACD (Status Ongoing)
- 6. Identify and engage other strategic partners that support the mission, vision, and goals of the Caucus (*Status Ongoing*)

#### **Next Steps:**

- Create work group to develop common language, business plan, and business case (Status In-progress)
  - a. Develop these in work groups
  - b. Bring draft materials to full Caucus for review
- 2. Create work group to develop communications strategy and engagement platform (Status Inprogress)
  - a. Develop these in work groups
  - b. Bring draft materials to full Caucus for review
- 3. Discuss whether to pursue creating seats on PSP or other regional boards for the Caucus (Status No action)
  - a. Create and prioritize a list of regional forums of interest
  - b. Decide whether Caucus needs a seat, or if WSCC could represent Caucus there
  - c. Pursue membership as appropriate
- 4. Policy proposals (Status Ongoing)
  - a. Follow Operating Procedure protocols to comment on legislative proposals
  - b. Work with WSCC and WACD to identify other policy proposals of interest, and follow Operating Procedures to develop Caucus positions
  - c. As needed, develop Caucus policy proposals.
- 5. Strengthen relationship with key partners (Status Ongoing)
  - a. Provide WACD with ideas on how to focus its limited resources to support Caucus activities
  - b. Schedule a conversation between the Caucus Chair and the WACD Board to discuss how the Caucus and WACD can work together
  - c. Schedule a conversation between the Caucus Chair and WSCC to discuss how the Caucus and WSCC can work together

- d. Work with WACD and WSCC on reaching out to other conservation districts across the state to achieve conservation objectives
- e. Clearly communicate to WSCC and WACD the PSCD Caucus priorities and activities
- 6. Identify and engage other strategic partners (Status Ongoing)
  - a. Identify key strategic partners and the rationale for the strategic relationship
  - b. Identify opportunities for proactive engagement
  - c. Develop engagement plans for strategic partners
  - d. Engage strategic partners
  - e. Establish long-term action plans with strategic partners
